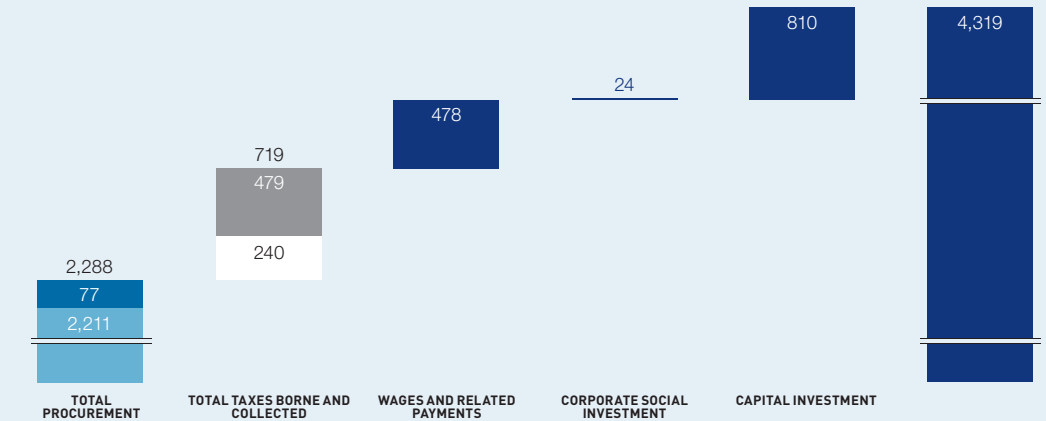

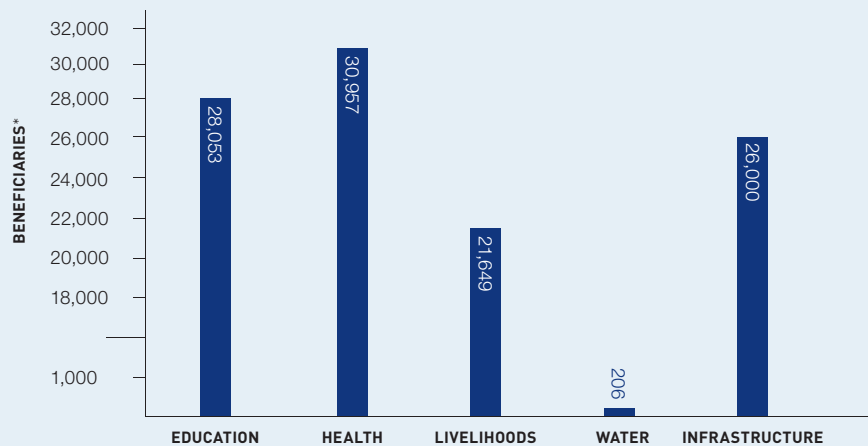
2019 IRON ORE BRAZIL TAX & ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTION (BRLm)

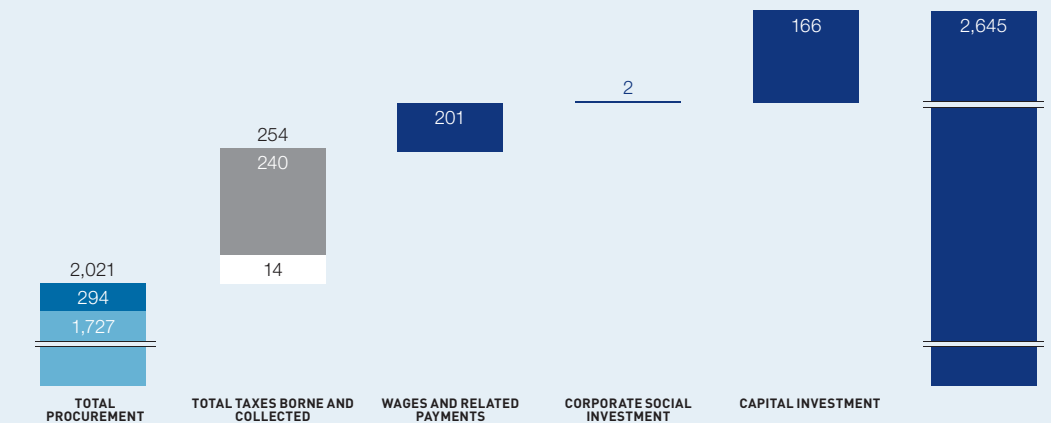

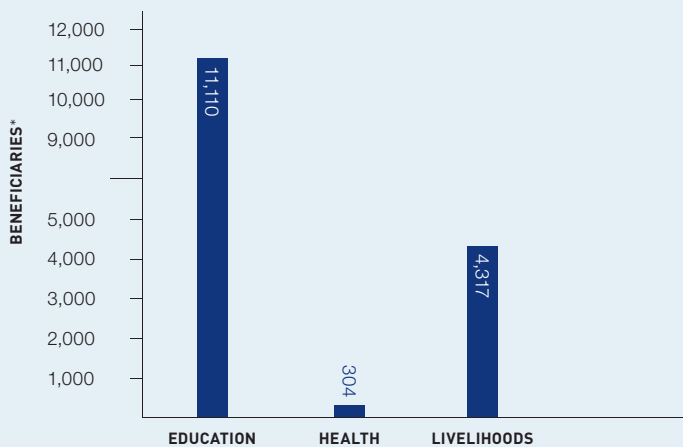
2019 NICKEL TAX & ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTION (BRLm)
